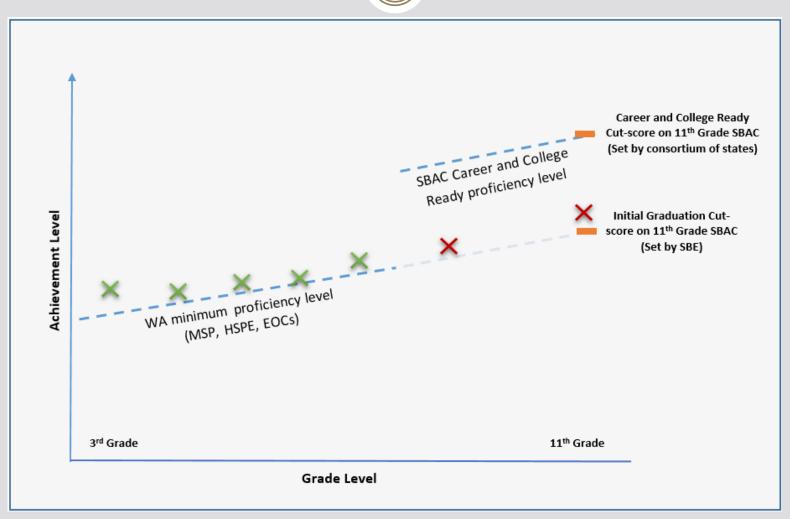


#### SBE position on Assessments
