This project will provide professional development for K-12 teachers, principals, assistant principals, and highly-qualified paraprofessionals across Washington state. The faculty team will provide training in 3 tracks: 1) Teaching endorsements 2) Since Time Immemorial curriculum, and 3) Smarter Balanced Digital Library. We will use a train-the-trainer model to deliver training in a hybrid format. School-based trainers will come to the University of Washington Tacoma twice to attend the trainers' institute. They will use faculty-developed materials to facilitate training when they return to their schools. The goals of this project are to: 1) strengthen participants' core academic content knowledge, standards-based instructional strategies, knowledge on formative assessment, and understanding to integrate the Since Time Immemorial Curriculum into the school curriculum; and 2) strengthen the instructional leadership of principals and assistant principals. We will evaluate the participants' performance and their impact on K-12 learners throughout and at the end of the project.
