Roles and Responsibilities



Washington Student Achievement Council (WSAC)

Administers the program by developing rules and policies, collecting and analyzing data, and distributing funds.

Communicates with students about their scholarship and applications.

Provides program resources to institutions, partners, support providers, and students.



College Success Foundation (CSF)

Supports institutions in building systems, networks, and strategies to serve Passport students.

Provides student response and intervention activities.

Coordinates with WSAC to convene Passport advisory committee.



Families and Students

Receive assistance from SETuP providers, college support staff, and CSF.

Participate in activities geared toward college enrollment.

Able to contact WSAC for specific program information, eligibility status, and other administrative questions.



Institutions and Contractors (college staff, ANEW, SETuP/IL providers)

Assist students with college and apprenticeship preparation activities and applications.

Provide support and guidance to students enrolled in college, apprenticeships, and pre-apprenticeships.

Help students overcome barriers to educational and occupational success.

WSAC and partners such as the College Success Foundation, social service providers, and education professionals work together, each with a distinct and important role in supporting Passport students.
