- ✓ Apply for admission to an eligible Washington college or university.
  - ⇒ Inquire about class registration.

## ATTENTION DREAMERS!

A new state law has expanded eligibility for the **Washington State Need Grant** to low income, non-citizen students who meet the program's eligibility requirements and also satisfy the residency criteria below:

- Have graduated (or will do so before beginning college) from a Washington high school, or obtained a GED®.
- Have lived in Washington for three years prior to, and continuously since earning the high school diploma or equivalent.

## HOW TO APPLY—THE WASFA

To apply for the State Need Grant, students who are unable to file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) due to immigration status, may instead complete the **free Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA)**.

Once completed, this **free** web-based application will allow eligible Washington colleges to use the financial information provided by the student to determine their eligibility to receive the **State Need Grant**.

**Note:** *Eligibility for the State Need Grant does not guarantee an award, as the grant is provided on a funds available basis.*

The sooner students complete a WASFA, the better chance they have for consideration of limited State Need Grant funds.
