LEARN Session #2 – September 10 Session Themes

Networking Format

- Flexible, open structure with themed breakout rooms was highly valued.
- The ability to move between conversations helped facilitate more effective networking.
- Participants appreciated the opportunity to connect with a wide variety of organizations.
- This format allowed for discussion that included sharing challenges, in addition to best practices.

Discussion Themes from Networking Session

Innovative Ideas

- Innovation in the partnerships in supporting a more inclusive culture for students.
- Emphasis on mapping pathways for students and ensuring access to opportunities.

Systems Improvement

- Systems are still set up primarily for "traditional age" students.
- Uncertainty around defining and implementing "innovative practices."
- The need for coaching and good practices to be more widely accessible, not limited to specific groups.

Building Partnerships

- Stronger partnerships with employers are needed to support ongoing learning and skill development.
- Employers should actively facilitate continued education for their employees.

Untopic

- Data and Resource Development
- Need for improved data collection and usage to track progress, especially at the local level.
- Desire for a follow-up survey to capture key ideas and move forward with resource development.



Eligibility

- Senior standing (90 + earned credit hours, 30 or less hours to complete)
- Recent stop-out period (fall or spring semester)
- Overall and institution grade point average of 2.0
- Pursuing first bachelor's degree

1,125 graduates since fall 2013

- Average student is 36 years old with 2.6 GPA and only 14 credit hours remaining to earn degree
- 100+ students graduating per academic year
- Scholarship available for those who previously exhausted federal aid

Outreach: Lessons Learned

- You MUST have something different for adults to return to
- Must have someone in charge of this effort
- Use data (check against National Student Clearinghouse)
- Check for financial and judicial holds BEFORE reaching out
- Ask students why they left; if institutional issues, work to prevent those
- Tell their success stories brag about them often!!!

Credit for Prior Learning

- College level *LEARNING* and skills acquired outside the classroom through work/life experience and through formal and informal education activities
- College level learning CAN and DOES happen outside our classrooms.
- Nothings says "we do <u>NOT</u> value you" than making an adult take a class in something they already know.
- Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) = Prior Learning Assessment (PLA)



THE PLA BOOST

Results from a 72-Institution Study of Prior Learning Assessment and Adult Student Outcomes

For more than 50 years, colleges and universities have used a range of different methods to award college credit for learning that takes place outside of the classroom—particularly learning from work, life, and military experiences. These methods—often called *prior learning assessment (PLA)* or credit for prior learning (CPL)—value the learning that many students bring with them to college. CAEL and WICHE recently partnered with 72 postsecondary institutions to explore the benefits of PLA for adult learners. Data on more than 230,000 adult students showed that having PLA credits is associated with better student outcomes like higher credential completion, cost savings, and time savings. Further, PLA boosted completion rates for adult students of color, low income adult students, and adult students across the academic performance spectrum. The evidence showed that PLA has strong potential to be a tool for closing equity gaps in postsecondary achievement, provided it is made more accessible to students who could benefit the most.

CPL AT UOFM

- Available at undergraduate and graduate level
- Includes military credit, pre-assessed experiences, and portfolio development
- Evaluated by faculty and application to degree program determined by department
