

Council will hear from Tacoma Public Schools and the Road Map Project

Olympia—On April 13, the council will consider how the work of collective impact coalitions relates to the 2016 Strategic Action Plan. The council will hear from Tacoma Public Schools and the University of Washington-Tacoma. They have partnered with local community organizations to improve high school graduation. In south Seattle and south King County, the Community Center for Educational Results sponsors the Road Map Project. This project is a community-wide effort to improve student achievement from cradle to college and career.

The council will also hear updates on the 2016 legislative session and the Guaranteed Education Tuition program. The meeting will be held on Wednesday, April 13, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. in Renton.
