## **Enhance Consumer Protection.**

The Washington Student Achievement Council is charged with regulatory oversight designed to protect students through a variety of programs. These include degree authorization, state student financial aid, and program approval for veteran's education benefits.

Additional resources are needed to provide the necessary oversight of Washington's higher education institutions. Supplemental funding will increase efficiencies and provide better protection of students' investments in higher education.

Degree Authorization: 58 nonexempt institutions are authorized to operate in Washington. Recent school closures and financial instability in a number of schools have raised the importance of increased monitoring and proactive

technical assistance. Though institutions pay fees to support Degree Authorization activities, the fees do not support the operational demands of the agency. Supplemental funding would allow the Student Achievement Council to visit every school on a biennial basis and would provide greater flexibility for targeted visits and interventions as issues emerge among our authorized schools.

**State Financial Aid: 68 approved institutions participate in state financial aid programs.** Supplemental funding would allow the Student Achievement Council to conduct proactive on-site visits for newly participating institutions and provide training for new financial aid administrators. Additional resouces would allow for another 8-10 school

visits for training and compliance purposes annually. Where there is overlap with degree authorization, efficiencies would be gained by having one staff member visit the school for dual purposes.

Program Approval for Veteran's Educational Benefits: The Student Achievement Council is responsible for approval, oversight, and outreach activities to ensure veterans can access earned higher education benefits.

Without additional funding, the

Student Achivement Council will not be able to maintain current levels of program supervision and outreach.

The supplemental request would provide funding for a shared staff positon. This will result in increased school site visits, enhanced on-site training for financial aid administrators.

Strong oversight of our schools is necessary to protect students' investments in higher education.
