Washington Student Achievement Council (WSAC)

Administers the program by developing rules and policies, data collection and analysis, and distributing funds.

Communicates with students about their scholarship and applications.

Provides districts, partners, and students with program resources.

WCCIN WASHINGTON COLLEGE ACCESS NETWORK

Washington College Access Network (WCAN)

Housed within the College Success Foundation.

Employs ten staff who support districts and schools with regional expertise and trainings.

Supports partners in building systems and strategies from sign-up to financial aid application.

Families, students, school staff, districts, and stakeholders

Receive assistance from WCAN, schools, and districts.

Able to contact WSAC for specific program information, application status, and other administrative questions.



School Staff (administrators, teachers, and counselors)

Assist students and families in signing up and accessing the scholarship.

Track and facilitate application completion via WSAC portal.

Help students understand the opportunities that College Bound Scholarship provides.
