- Resume or Activity Log
- Interventions and Academic Supports

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- Individual for each student
- Connects with 4-Year Course Plan
- Connects with career pathway or college major
- Identifies steps, timeline and who will help



  - Attendance, Failing courses, Credit deficient, Equity


