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PROJECT TITLE

No Textbook Cost General Education Pathway: An Effort to Increase Retention at Central Washington University

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The goal of this project is to provide Central Washington University (CWU) students an opportunity to complete the General Education Program – required for graduation – without significant textbook cost. Project leadership will work with faculty to adapt between 23 and 27 courses in the General Education Framework, creating several paths to General Education completion without the burden of expensive textbooks.

When a course is identified as a high enrollment course with expensive resources, a librarian, either the campus coordinator or a course designer, will break down the learning outcomes for the course and do the first review of materials to see if there are existing Open Educational Resources (OER) to achieve the learning outcomes. If there are no OER resources available, the librarians will look for library resources to achieve the learning outcomes.

CWU will provide faculty stipends to participate in the project. Faculty will modify their course curriculum and adapt OER materials in their course in place of current costly textbooks. Project participation will require faculty to continue using the OER materials for the next three quarters.

Project staff will survey students to provide feedback to participating faculty and solicit additional suggestions on the use of OER materials in their courses.

ANNUAL COURSE MATERIALS SAVINGS

CWU estimates an initial \$544,140 per quarter – or \$1,632,420 annually - in course material savings to students during its rollout of the new OER materials during the 2019-2020 academic year and anticipates 14,820 students will be positively impacted.

ANTICIPATED ACTIVITIES

Initial Roll Out – Spring 2019, Summer 2019

The Campus Coordinator will issue a call for proposals to faculty teaching in the new General Education Program and offer stipends to faculty for their participation. Participation includes using existing OER materials in their course and continuing to use OER materials for following three quarters.

The project team will survey faculty on the ease or difficulty of OER adoption to better identify other courses where new course materials that are free or low cost could be most successful.

Student Survey – Fall 2019, Winter 2020, Spring 2020

Faculty members will survey the students at the end of each quarter regarding the use of OER materials in the course. The student responses will provide essential feedback to faculty and form the basis for determining the successful application of OER as course materials. CWU will archive the survey results and analyses in ScholarWorks – CWU's institutional repository – making them publically available.

COURSES AND STUDENTS IMPACTED

CWU identified 23 courses in its new General Education Framework that are part of the general education pathway and where significant textbook savings would greatly benefit its students.
