





Stakeholder Feedback

- Stakeholders were very excited and supportive of all proposals to increase enrollment and address students' basic needs.
- Overwhelming support for the Challenge Fund proposal
- Identified students' access to basic needs, especially childcare, as an urgent priority and suggested these be more integrated with other proposals.
- General consensus that families/students need to have direct contact with trained navigators from the community; this will ensure equity and basic needs are met.
- General concern about sustainability with grant funded programs and desire to build on existing efforts.





Stakeholder Feedback

Direct Enrollment

% of Stakeholder Support	Proposal
55%	Establish the Career and College Promise Community Challenge Fund to increase college going pathways for BIPOC and lower income students by investing in local communities
39%	Create a Statewide College and Career Advising Fellowship that would fund college students to be peer and near peer mentors on college and career planning
22%	Invest in regional student data management systems that cross sectors to respond to real- time student progress and equity measures
20%	Establish a statewide dual credit fund that is simple and transparent to ensure all high school students can access a dual credit program, at no cost.
10%	Extend OtterBot texting support to cover the full cycle of College Bound Scholarship students, from middle school through 12th grade



Stakeholder Feedback

Basic Needs

% of Stakeholder Support	Proposal
59%	Fund statewide local navigators who guide and support all students and community members to access public benefits and other emergency or basic needs resources.
47%	Embed a model of funding in postsecondary education that would ensure students receiving WCG will also receive food
39%	Determine the prevalence of postsecondary students' unmet needs - for food, housing, childcare, mental healthcare, digital access- on campus, regional and state levels by implementing an annual coordinated assessment. Research barriers to access and regional opportunities.
29%	Support postsecondary students experiencing homelessness by expanding pilot grants for Supporting Students Experiencing Homelessness to all public two and four-year institutions.
