



What is the College Bound Scholarship?

High school students: College Bound is an early commitment of state financial aid to eligible students who enroll in middle school and fulfill the College Bound pledge. The College Bound Scholarship combines with other state financial aid (like the Washington College Grant) to cover average tuition, some fees, and a book allowance at over 65 institutions in Washington.

What is the pledge?

In middle school, College Bound students promise to:

- Graduate from a Washington State high school or home school with a cumulative 2.0 GPA or higher.
- Submit a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) or WASFA (Washington Application for State Financial Aid) as soon after October 1 as possible in your senior year of high school.
- Have no felony convictions.

After graduation, how do I get College Bound?

- Meet the College Bound pledge requirements.
- Enroll in college within a year of completing your high school diploma.
- Stay in good standing at your college.
- Apply for financial aid every year you are in college.
- Meet the income requirement on the median family income chart.

What does College Bound need from me?

- Make sure College Bound has your current contact information.
- Check with your high school counselor to make sure you're on track to meet the pledge requirements.
- Prepare for your college search by looking through the list of eligible schools on the College Bound website at wsac.wa.gov/sfa-institutions.

Otterbot is a free texting service created to support high school seniors who have signed up for the College Bound Scholarship. Otter sends financial aid info and reminders. Students can access Otterbot via text message 24 hours a day, seven days a week by texting "Hi Otter" to 360-928-7281.
