#### Partnership Panel Themes

#### Effective Strategies for Building and Sustaining Partnerships:

- 1. Aligning Values and Mission: Partnerships thrive when there is a shared commitment to common goals and values.
- 2. Active Communication and Listening: Successful collaboration is built on open communication, especially by listening carefully to partners' perspectives and needs.
- 3. Internal Partnerships: Developing strong internal relationships within your organization is just as important as external collaborations.
- 4. **Respecting Partner Needs**: Valuing and addressing the unique needs of each partner fosters stronger, more meaningful connections.
- 5. **Shared Language**: Establishing a common language ensures everyone is on the same page and can streamline collaboration.
- 6. **Understanding Boundaries**: A clear understanding of the boundaries within partnerships helps maintain focus and respect between parties.
- 7. **Recognizing Existing Partners**: Acknowledging and leveraging the contributions of current partners reinforces collaboration and encourages long-term commitment.

#### Key Factors for Success in Partnerships:

- 1. Advisory Committees: Engaging stakeholders through advisory committees offers valuable insights and guides the direction of partnerships.
- 2. **Defining Success**: Clearly articulating what success looks like ensures that everyone is working towards the same objectives.
- 3. **Regular Check-ins**: Consistent communication and partner check-ins help address challenges early and maintain alignment.
- 4. **Understanding Partnership Dynamics**: Recognizing the nuances of each partnership, such as power dynamics and roles, strengthens collaboration.
- 5. "Slowing Down to Go Fast": Taking time to carefully plan and develop partnerships at the start can lead to more efficient outcomes in the long run.

- 6. **Building Trust and Empowering Partners**: Partnerships flourish when trust is built, when partners feel empowered and share decision-making power.
- 7. **Leadership Investment**: Leadership's commitment to partnerships, demonstrated through time, resources, and support, is crucial for long-term success.
- 8. Learning from Others: Drawing on the experiences and best practices of others in your network helps refine and enhance partnership efforts.
