WEIAOB Meeting Minutes

May 8, 2025 10:00 a.m.

Meeting called to order at 10:02 a.m.

Action: Approving the Meeting Agenda for May 8, 2025

Motion made to approve the Board's meeting agenda for May 8, 2025. Motion seconded.

Presentation: 2025 Legislative Session and WEIA Expenditures Summaries

Presenters: Joel Anderson

Materials: 2025 Legislative Session Summary, 2025 WEIA Expenditures Summary

- The 2025 legislative session demonstrated that there was minimal funding available for new programs. Legislation was also passed to significantly increase the amount of revenue coming into WEIA each biennium.
- The Legislature included language in its 2025-27 operating budget that allows WEIA expenditures to supplant other higher education funding. It is the Legislature's intent to continue this practice during the 2027-29 biennium.
 - This language was included because \$400 million from WEIA (instead of General Fund-State, GF-S) was appropriated to UW for general operating support.
- The Board conducted a thorough review of agency decision packages and other proposals from external stakeholders prior to the 2025 legislative session. All Board recommendations represented policy level funding and many of them were not funded by the Legislature.

- Proposals that received some funding include:
 - Continuing the Native American Student Scholarship pilot program (WSU)—
 \$2.2 million
 - Continuing the Shelton Promise pilot program (TESC)—\$901,000
 - Expanding the Student Aid Outreach and Completion Initiative pilot program (SBCTC)—\$340,000
- The 2025-27 operating budget included a significant increase in WEIA expenditures for compensation.
- The Legislature passed multiple bills to increase WEIA revenues by approximately \$1.4 billion over the four-year outlook (2025-27 and 2027-29 biennia).
- SB 5785 made 60% median family income (MFI) the permanent threshold to receive a maximum WA Grant award and cut both WA Grant and College Bound Scholarship awards at non-public institutions.
- The 2025-27 operating budget appropriated \$77.9 billion from Near General Fund-Outlook (NGF-O) accounts. \$1.6 billion of this amount came from WEIA.
 - UW received \$544.9 million from WEIA—a number heavily influenced by the \$400 million fund source alignment from GF-S.
- The 2025-27 operating budget included \$852.5 million in carryforward level expenditures (53.3%), \$240.5 million in maintenance level (ML) expenditures (15.0%), and \$490.2 million in policy level (PL) expenditures (30.2%) from WEIA.
 - The largest changes in ML and PL expenditures, respectively, were \$221.2 million for WSAC and \$459.7 million for UW.
- The share of total WEIA expenditures for WA Grant has increased from \$191.2 million (23.6%) in the 2021-23 biennium to \$318.6 million (31.6%) in 2023-25 and now \$458.7 million (39.9%) in 2025-27.
- The share of total WEIA expenditures for compensation has increased from \$678,000 (0.1%) in the 2021-23 biennium to \$34.1 million (3.3%) in 2023-25 and now \$179.2 million (11.3%) in 2025-27.
- The Board does not currently have enough infrastructure or capacity to respond to changing budget conditions during legislative sessions.

Comments & Questions:

- How are funding cuts at the federal level impacting changes to state financial aid?
 - WA Grant and the College Bound Scholarship are fully funded by the state. These programs' award amounts will not change because of federal funding cuts.
 - For more information on other potential impacts, WSAC's <u>work session</u> for the House Postsecondary Education and Workforce Committee (March 26, 2025) may be helpful to watch.
- Board members expressed interest in seeing how WEIA's role in funding state higher education costs (compared to GF-S and other accounts) has changed over time.
- Board members expressed concern that higher education faced significant cuts in the 2025-27 operating budget, especially compared to other sectors.
- As the Board's Co-chair representing business, was Jane consulted during the 2025 legislative session about higher education funding from WEIA or elsewhere?

 No, aside from brief questions about <u>SB 5400</u>. (The original version of the bill made appropriations from WEIA to support local news journalism.)

Presentation and Discussion: Board Governance Workgroup

- The Board does not have fundamental components (bylaws, transition procedures for Co-chairs, etc.) to help it function effectively over time.
- The Board may need legal guidance from the Attorney General or other state agencies regarding how to draft bylaws.

Comments & Questions:

- Board members expressed support for creating a Board governance workgroup to establish bylaws and additional guidance, as needed.
- Some Board members expressed interest in drafting legislation to amend the Board's statute (RCW 28B.77.310) as well.

Action: Establishing a Board Governance Workgroup

Motion made to establish a Board governance workgroup for the purpose of developing formal bylaws and additional guidance, as needed.

Presentation: WA Public Enrollment Trends—Fall 2024 Enrollment Update

Presenters: Jill Huynh, Dan Oliver

Materials: WSAC Fall 2024 Enrollment Update

- o During the COVID-19 pandemic recovery period (2022-24):
 - Enrollment across community and technical colleges (CTCs) has grown more than across public four-year institutions.
 - Full-time enrollment at public four-year institutions has declined.
 - Enrollment of need-based aid recipients has increased for both sectors. (WA Grant eligibility was expanded beginning in the 2020-21 academic year.)
 - New student enrollment at CTCs has surpassed public four-year institutions.

Comments & Questions:

- Does WSAC have data on changes in transfer rates from CTCs to public four-year institutions?
 - Yes. An update on this data will be released later in the summer, but it is not available yet.
- Are some CTCs observing more enrollment than others? If so, why?

- Proximity to campus can be an influential factor for postsecondary enrollment. WSAC continues to research a variety of factors impacting enrollment rates.
- Will the change in MFI levels (60% vs. 65%) to receive maximum WA Grant awards impact enrollment?
 - It is difficult to track this impact across academic years, but WSAC is considering how to measure this.


