








Top 20 in-demand jobs in Washington State

And the career training or college education required to obtain them.













70% of Washington jobs require education beyond high school—and that number is on the rise. But which job is right for you or your student? Which job is likely to have the most job openings, and what do employers want to see?

The top 10 in-demand jobs at the midlevel

This midlevel category includes jobs requiring education or training beyond high school but less than a bachelor's degree. Credentials include short-term or long-term certificates, apprenticeships, and associate degrees.
