- Advocates for the economic, social, and civic benefits of postsecondary education.







Ongoing stakeholder engagement via policy cluster work groups

*Our annual policy showcase—last hosted in June 2024—may happen in early summer or fall 2025 due to the longer legislative session calendar (Jan. 13–Apr. 27).



- Budget deficit of more than \$12 billion over the next four years (2025–29)
- Numerous reasons for the deficit:
 - Lower projected revenues
 - Increased costs to maintain existing programs
 - Onset of deferred program costs
 - End of COVID-19 pandemic-era federal funding (and state funding backfill)

<u>Takeaway</u>: There is limited funding available in 2025–27 for discretionary spending.

All six public four-year institutions and SBCTC had targeted budget reductions proposed, ranging from **\$108,000** (TESC) to **\$2.9 million** (SBCTC).
