2025 – 2026 Academic Year Goals and Progress

Presenter: Natalie Alvarado

Key points: Natalie reviewed campaign goals and shared updated data on goals one through four.

Campaign Goals:

Natalie reviewed this year's campaign goals:

- Increase financial aid completion for all WA high school seniors.
- Ensure 46,000 seniors complete the FAFSA or WASFA.
- Raise FRPL-eligible student completions by 6% or more in at least 150 high schools.
- Close the gap in FAFSA completions between FRPL and on-FRPL students.
- Reduce disparities in FAFSA completion rates, especially among those from underrepresented racial/ethnic groups.

Goal #1:

Natalie reviewed progress toward campaign goal #1 using the chart:

- As of March 16: Class of 2026 FAFSA & WASFA completion rate is 45%.
- 29 out of 53 weeks to go until the campaign ends.
- 84% of the way to our goal of 46,000 completions.
- This time last year, we were at 29,833 completions.
- This week, we are at 38,384 completions.
- Last year's final total was 44,371 completions, we are expected to meet or exceed last year's final total.
- Natalie stated we need to keep maintaining at least 1,000 new FAFSAs per week.
- Since January, we have averaged 1,077 new FAFSA's per week.

Goal #2:

Natalie reviewed progress toward goal #2 using the chart:

- Started at 30 schools in October/November, meeting the 6% FRPL FAFSA completion goal.
- In December, 63 schools met the goal.
- January 76 schools met the goal.
- February 106 schools met the goal.
- In March so far, 140 schools have met the goal, with 10 schools away from meeting the goal.

Goal #3:

Natalie reviewed progress toward goal #3 using the chart:

- January 5, FRPL was 27% compared to 33% non-FRPL.
- March 16, FRPL increased to 38% while non-FRPL is now at 47%, a 9-percentage point gap.

- This is a new way of looking at FRPL data since we have not tracked it weekly. In the future, it will help us identify patterns, adjust supports, and make better-informed decisions about additional outreach.

Natalie turned over to Sarah for a brief update. Sarah shared that House Bill 2214 makes it easier for some students to qualify for the maximum WA grant by automatically recognizing students in grades 10-12 from households receiving SNAP as income eligible. WSAC is starting with a 12th-grade pilot this spring, along with March 26 training and outreach to likely eligible students, to help more low-income students learn about and access financial aid.

Goal #4:

Natalie reviewed progress toward goal #4 using the chart:

- Our equity gap score is 2.33, which means the group with the highest FAFSA completion rate is completing at just over two and a half times the rate of the group with the lowest completion rate.
- Asian students at 58% compared to Native Hawaiian Pacific Islander students at 25%.

Strategy Progress and Highlights

Presenter: Sarah Weiss

Key points: Sarah shared updates on strategy progress for 1D- WA annual recognition award, 3A – FAFSA Portal updates, and statewide coordination efforts.

1D –Washington’s Annual Statewide College & Career Culture Recognition Program:

Sarah reviewed what we’ve done and what we’re seeing to how we’re adjusting for Strategy 1D.

- *What we’ve done and what we’re seeing:*
 - Worked with the Association of Washington School Principals (AWSP).
 - Guidance on how to best encourage and recognize schools who are building and support post-high school planning and college-going culture (inclusive of FAFSA completion).
 - Self-nomination process with WSAC data (mirrors AWSP awards).
 - Interest in this process, but a need to increase visibility.
- *How we’re adjusting:*
 - Additional promotion via WSAC and partner communication channels.
 - Dedicated website: wsac.wa.gov/ccc-recognition
 - Extended nomination period through the end of June, with recognition happening in early Fall.

3A – FAFSA Portal:

Sarah reviewed what we're seeing and how we're adjusting for Strategy 3A. 254 districts have a new DSA in place. 93% of students statewide are in a district with an active portal user.

- *What we're seeing:*
 - Solid engagement with districts and schools on renewing college access initiatives data-sharing agreements (DSA) which includes FAFSA and College Bound portal data.
- *How we're adjusting:*
 - Individualized calls to districts that haven't responded yet has been the most successful.
 - Working with local and community partners as trusted messengers to support final DSA completion.

Supporting Statewide Coordination Efforts:

Sarah reviewed what we're seeing and how we're adjusting for statewide coordination efforts.

- *What we're seeing:*
 - Conversations in multiple arenas around the same issues, complexities, and brainstorming around possible solutions.
 - WSAC leads several workgroups and convenings where these issues are raised.
 - Advisory Board.
 - Washington Financial Aid Training Workgroup (co-led by WSAC and SBCTC; formerly Aim Higher Washington Steering Committee).
 - Regional Trainings.
 - While many barriers, issues, and intricacies vary regionally, there are similarities and benefits to connecting statewide to reduce duplication and inspire connectivity and learning.
- *How we're adjusting:*
 - Connecting with partners who have expressed these concerns, as there are possible convenings already being discussed by groups statewide.
 - Joining a partnership effort for a virtual statewide FAFSA completion convening that brings together community partners, K-12 districts and schools, and higher education.
 - Additional convening considerations:
 - Timing (kick off in the fall?)
 - Virtual, hybrid, in-person
 - How to bring in regionality but still provide opportunities for partners to learn from others in different corners of the state.

2026 Legislative Session: Update on Relevant Bills

Presenter: Joel Anderson

Key points:

- Joel reviewed 2026 legislative updates for Senate Bill 5841 from Senator Boehnke, which passed the House and is currently awaiting Governor Ferguson's signature. Noting that the last day of the 2026 legislative session was Thursday, March 12.

SB 5841:

- Requires financial aid completion data from WSAC to be integrated into OSPI's High School and Beyond Plan.
- Passed House (92-4) on Mar. 6; delivered to Gov. Ferguson on Mar. 12; awaiting signature.

Collaboration and Discussion

Key points: Sarah reviewed the advisory board members. Some folks have shared what they have been seeing, trying, and the challenges within their networks. Sarah went over the timeline of the academic year. Shared Your Future, Funded campaign website, and details of the campaign before discussion with specific ways they can engage with the campaign. Sarah shared an ask for Advisory Board members, and stated that we will bring guest speakers to highlight bright spots and share issues.

Roundtable Discussion (Part1: Follow-up From Last Month)**Highlights**

- There are several exciting efforts underway, including a Mariners game day event on April 20 to promote college and career pathways, a statewide FAFSA/WASFA completion summit in May, and continued WA Grant awareness campaigns this spring and again in fall 2026.
 - At the same time, a major challenge is that schools and partners do not have enough flexible funding or staff capacity, so there is a need for smaller, less restricted funds to support local outreach and student events.
- Right now, the focus is on meeting one-on-one with seniors who have not finished their financial aid application, helping them work through questions and barriers, and celebrating with them when they complete it.
 - The FAFSA support experience has mostly been faster and helpful this year, with the main issue being one system outage that delayed email verification, while a challenge overall is still finding time to plan a larger collaboration with partners during a very busy season.
- Shared that calling FAFSA support has worked better than expected, and their school is helping students by bringing college partners into classrooms, inviting families to campus visits, and making college and financial aid feel more understandable and possible. They also said clearer dual credit information, stronger family engagement, and exciting opportunities like the Mariners event are helping build student interest and motivation around college and financial aid.
- Staff are using weekly reports to identify seniors who still need help, and those check-ins are leading to good conversations with students about completing financial aid. Their next big focus is supporting parents, since that has become the final step for many students, and they are looking at ways to be available beyond the regular school day.
- They created a fun celebration tool using a fake \$100 bill template and outreach materials to recognize students who complete financial aid, and it has helped spark more student interest and conversation.
 - They have also seen strong results by calling families in their home language and providing interpreters at financial aid events, which has helped move their school to number one in the district for financial aid completion.

Timeline

- Fall/Winter:
 - Prepare and initial financial aid application efforts
- Late Winter/Early Spring:
 - Keep building on momentum
 - Preparing higher need schools for success
 - Training and capacity building
- Spring/End of Academic Year:
 - March 11: toolkits and resources published
 - Week of April 20: big push to directly support students with their financial aid apps
 - After April 20: It's not too late messaging and final efforts

Your Future, Funded

- **Goal:**
 - 1,000 applications per week!
 - Every senior has at least one touchpoint and check-in
 - Build off year-long efforts and culminate with a focused week
 - Inaugural effort as part of the Washington Completes FAFSA Campaign
- **Why:**
 - Still time for students to access financial aid at most institutions
 - Timing is after spring breaks, but ahead of most HS graduation preparations
- **Who:**
 - Students who are unsure about their plans or unaware of aid programs and opportunities
 - Parents who need to complete their sections of the application
- **Website:** <https://wsac.wa.gov/your-future-funded>
 - Specific engagement opportunities for schools and partners.
 - Tabs with new resources, calendars, templates, and guides to support working with seniors and their families.
 - Encourage use of the FAFSA dashboard and WIAA leaderboard and inspire friendly competition.

 - Virtual financial aid night for students and parents (April 22 and 23).
 - FAFSA completion portal access and supports.

Roundtable Discussion (Part 2: Plugging into *Your Future, Funded*)

Sarah asked if there are any refinements and shared some examples the Advisory Board would suggest after seeing a snapshot of the website and what the plan is for Your Future, Funded campaign.

Highlights

- Advisory board members will share Your Future, Funded campaign with their respective networks.
- A question was raised about whether there is a way to track what schools and partners are doing through the Your Future Funded campaign so the group can better understand what actions are helping move financial aid numbers. In response, it was shared that a simple online survey has been created to start collecting that information and should be added to the Your Future Funded materials.
- For next year, it would help to include some financial support for schools, especially smaller and rural ones, so they have more capacity to use the Your Future Funded tools. The materials are valuable, but many schools need even small amounts of funding to put them into action.
- They said one of the biggest needs is having dedicated staff whose main job is helping students complete financial aid, because school counselors often do not have the time to do that level of one-on-one outreach. They suggested the group should look at how the 1835 specialist model is working and, if it is effective, consider expanding it to more districts.
- They shared that dedicated staff are important, and the data is showing that some schools need more repeated, one-on-one support with students than others. They are tracking how often staff meet with students, and while data collection is not yet consistent across all 1835 sites, there is a push to make it more standardized.
