Affordability

- Making postsecondary education more affordable to students.
- Increasing FAFSA/WASFA completion.
- Innovative solutions to reduce student debt.

Enrollment

- Increasing dual credit participation for low-income students and/or other underrepresented populations.
- Enhancing College and Career going culture in high school or middle school.
- Addressing access barriers to college and career opportunities.
- Increasing college enrollment and/or career readiness through internships, apprenticeships, etc.
- Engaging and supporting working adults to finish college.

Completion

- Ensuring first generation and/or low-income students enrolling in college from K12 persist and complete postsecondary education.
- Transfer degrees/programs.
- Addressing unique barriers to degree completion for returning adults.
- Alternative Credit for Prior Learning, workforce credentials, and other type of transfers for working age adults.

Non-Academic Student Supports

- Addressing food and housing insecurity on college campuses.
- Increasing access to affordable childcare on college campuses.
- Providing emergency funds to students in college and career programs.
