WA Grant (WCG/WG-A/WCG-C)

Washington Student Achievement Council



WA Grant provides need-based financial aid to incomeeligible, <u>resident students</u> pursuing education beyond high school.

WA Grant is an entitlement, so any student who qualifies based on income and other program requirements, is eligible to receive the grant.









Program Requirements

A student must:

- Demonstrate financial need
- Be a resident of Washington state, attending an approved participating institution or apprenticeship program
- Have earned a high school diploma or equivalent
- Not be pursuing a degree in theology
- Not already achieved a bachelor's degree or higher
- Not be in default or owe a repayment on another state financial aid program

College Bound Commitment

College Bound is an early commitment of state financial aid that works with the Washington College Grant, to help pay for education after high school.

The amount of money students receive is based on average tuition (at public college rates), some fees, and a small amount for books.

- We often refer to this amount as the "College Bound Commitment."



Program Requirements

✓ Sign up for College Bound in middle school

Auto Enrollment

- Students who are in public school and eligible for free-and-reduced price lunch in 7th, 8th, or 9th grade.
- Students who are in state foster care or a dependent of the state between 7th grade and high school graduation.
- Students who are not auto-enrolled such as homeschooled students, need to complete a CBS application prior to 9th grade.
 - Students can contact WSAC's College Access and Initiatives office to verify enrollment at <u>CollegeBound@wsac.wa.gov</u>



Program Requirements

Once enrolled in college, a student must:

- ✓ Be a resident of Washington state, attending an approved participating institution
- ✓ Have graduated from a Washington high school or earned a high school equivalency*
- ✓ Complete a FAFSA or WASFA
- ✓ Have enrolled no later than the fall term one year after high school graduation
- \checkmark Be within 6-year eligibility time frame**
- ✓ Have a qualifying income (be within 0-65% MFI)
- ✓ Not pursuing a degree in theology
- ✓ Not be in default or owe a repayment on another state financial aid program
- ✓ Have no felony convictions
- * High school equivalency is new as of 2025-26
 ** 6-year time frame is new as of 2025-26



65% MFI or Lower

- To be eligible for CBS funding, the student must be at or below 65% MFI.
- Must be awarded WCG and PTC, before awarding CBS.
 - Students must be awarded all aid for which they are eligible at the beginning of each term to ensure students receive the full amount to which they are entitled.

WA Bridge Grant



The WA Bridge Grant is eliminated beginning 2025-26.



Passport to College (PTC)





Passport to College as a part of Passport to Careers was created to help increase high school completion, college enrollment, and college completion rates for state foster youth.



Provide eligible young people with:

- Pre-college/Career support
- Annual college scholarship
 - \$2,000 for 2025-26
- > Intensive support services while in college



Serves

- Youth who experienced foster care
 - Young people who experienced state, tribal, federal foster care, or were placed in WA through the Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children (ICPC) at any point after age 13.
- Unaccompanied homeless youth
 - Individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence AND not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian.



Eligibility

- State foster youth are automatically enrolled.
- Federal foster youth complete a consent form.
- Tribal foster youth complete consent form and tribal verification form.
- Financial aid office determines eligibility for unaccompanied homeless youth.
- WSAC receives data from OSPI for high school seniors experiencing homelessness.



Program Requirements

A student must:

 Be a resident of Washington state, attending an approved participating institution

- \checkmark Enroll in college prior to age 22
- ✓ Complete a FAFSA or WASFA
- ✓ Not be pursuing a degree in theology
- Not be in default or owe a repayment on another state financial aid program

National Guard Grant





The National Guard Grant helps members of the Washington National Guard, and their dependents, get an approved degree or certificate. Participants commit to serving one year (served concurrently with contract) in exchange for each year of funding.



Grant helps pay a portion of college costs not covered by other financial aid.



Need-Base, Conditional Grant

 Must meet eligibility and service obligation or grant will convert to loan

Program Requirements

A student must:

- ✓ WA National Guard Service Member in good standing
 - If Dependent: Must also have a valid DOD ID from the DEERS System
- Attend an accredited post-secondary institution in Washington State
 - Or WA Institution that provides training under the Montgomery GI Bill[®]
- ✓ Meet SAP requirements



2025-26 NGG Awards

Maximum NGG base award values will be the same for the 2025-26 academic year, as they were for 2024-25. Priority will be given to applicants without their first baccalaureate degree:

- ✓ Maximum NGG awards can also include up to a \$500 one-time allowance for books and supplies.
- ✓ Applicants who are eligible to apply for Federal Tuition Assistance (FTA) are encouraged to apply for both NGG and FTA.

Washington Award for Vocational Excellence

(WAVE)





Update from 2025 Legislative Session:

WAVE funding will be suspended beginning the 2026-27 academic year. Future funding is TBD.





The Washington Award for Vocational Excellence (WAVE) recognizes graduating high school seniors and community & technical college students for outstanding performance in career and technical (CTE) programs.



Recipients will be awarded up to approximately \$3,900 per year for up to two years. Awards cannot exceed the cost of tuition.



Program Requirements

A student must:

 High School: Completed (or are in the process of completing) their second course in a single career and technical education program

 Community & Technical College Student: Process of completing at least one year of a professional-technical program

 WAVE recipients will be provided this scholarship for up to two years (6 quarters, 4 semesters)



Application/Selection

- Workforce Training & Education Coordinating Board
 - ➤ co-administrator
- Student fills out Intent to Enroll
 - > required to begin use of the award within three years

FAA Certification

- SAP (Community & Technical College)
- 3.0 GPA (4-year institution)



Dollar Amount (max award) limit by legislation

- Academic Year Cohort differs based on legislation

State Work Study (SWS)



State Work Study is financial aid for low- and middle-income students. Qualifying students get an approved job, on- or off-campus, to support their education.

 The state contributes to the wages of work study employees at approved work study employers.

Program Requirements

A student must:

- Be a resident of Washington state, attending an approved participating institution
- ✓ Complete a FAFSA or WASFA
- \checkmark Enroll at least 1/2 time in an eligible program
- \checkmark Be eligible to work legally in the United States
- ✓ Not be pursuing a degree in theology
- ✓ Not be in default or owe a repayment on any state financial aid program

Repayment



WSAC provides two repayment policy options for colleges to choose from:

- Option 1: If a student commences attendance in all classes for which they were enrolled and awarded for, they are considered to have earned their award.
 or
- **Option 2**: Using the institution's census date which is the date by which the student's enrollments are 'frozen' and upon which financial aid is disbursed.

Institution collects funds from student

Institution to Bill (ITB)

 Must be collected or converted to In Repayment by final interim submission

Must be reported within 10 business days from the end of term or date of withdrawal; whichever is easier

In Repayment (IR)

Amount is collected from our contracted billing service



Institutions may cancel a repayment in limited circumstances.

- Examples include:
 - Proof of updated last date of attendance
 - Grade change
 - Proof of high school diploma

REMINDER: You must enter a clear explanation for any cancellations.

- Institutions must not accept payment for an "In Repayment" account and then cancel the debt in the Portal.
 - > Student may owe collection or other fees
 - > Creates inaccurate records
 - > Refer students directly to our billing service to make payment

WCG ELIGIBILITY ARCHIVE PROCESS TIPS TO CONSIDER

• **Timing is important!** WSAC updates WCG Archive Data once annually, in or around August.

Considerations:

- Run/re-run archive checks on Transfer students
- Re-run archive checks prior to disbursements
- Re-run archive checks in late August and follow up with student awards with low or no remaining QER

- Q. How do I re-calculate students when MFI or award amounts change after awarding has begun?
 - A. First, update the new MFI and Award amounts in the SACR WCG & CBS Eligibility tables, and then run the WCG **Recalculation Process Navigation:** Set Up SACR > Product Related

CBS ELIGIBILITY CHECKER PROCESS TIPS TO CONSIDER

• Timing is important! OSPI receives graduation information from May - August

Considerations:

- *Run/re-run eligibility checks on students who graduate late*
- Re-run eligibility checks prior to disbursements
- Re-run eligibility checks in late August and follow up with student awards if necessary



CBS ELIGIBILITY CHECKER PROCESS UNDERSTANDING WHO DOES WHAT/WHEN CONT'D

- Before packaging and especially before disbursement, the manual CBS Eligibility Checker process needs to be run
- This process will produce a list of SSNs to populate in the WSAC Secure Portal

QUERIES TO RUN CONTINUALLY AS PART OF PROCESS AND RECONCILIATION

QUERIES TO RUN AS PART OF PROCESSING AND RECONCILIATION

Query Name	Definition
CTC_FA_CBS_AND_SNG_LIST	List of CBS students and their WCG amounts should they have them. Per term
CTC_FA_CBS_SNG_NOT_AWARDED	Identifies students who have WCG and CBS eligibility, have a processing status of greater than applied, have enrollment in the prompted term, and do not have a WCG or CBS item type in an offered status greater than zero.
CTC_FA_SNG_ELIG_NOTPKGD	Identifies WCG eligible students who have already been packaged other aid but not WCG item types. This query will help identify students who primarily have less than a full-term of WCG eligibility remaining so are eliminated from auto packaging.
CTC_FA_SNG_RECALC_STUDENTS	Identifies students who have a WCG and/or CBS item types (regardless of dollar amount) and have an Aid Processing Status greater than Applied. It also displays recalculated WCG amount from the eligibility page, and CBS OK to Award and OK to Pay values.
CTC_FA_SNG_AWRD_RES_DISCRP	Selects students who have been awarded WCG and have discrepant data on Residency status between ISIR and Bio/Demo.
CTC_FA_CBS_ELIG_NOTPKGD	Query intended to be run after packaging, identifies College Bound Scholarship Eligible students who do not have a CBS FA Item Type with an Offered Amount greater than zero. This will help identify students who were not packaged because they have limited terms of eligibility remaining.
CTC_FA_SNG_ALL_RECORDS	Query intended to be run after loading WSAC's Archive response file. Filter the query results to find students who are Not Eligible due to No Remaining WCG, and Not Eligible due to Repayment Status.
