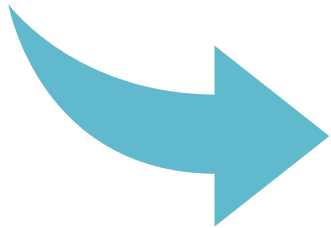

# History

**2019:**

Washington College Grant (WCG) program was established, replacing the State Need Grant (SNG)

The Workforce Education Investment Act (HB 2158) added guaranteed funding to WCG for all eligible apprentices, starting in the 2020-21 Academic Year.

**2022:** Washington College Grant – Connect is established through SSHB1835 beginning the 2023-24 AY.

**1969:** State Need Grant (SNG) program established

**2014:** The Legislature enacted the REAL Hope Act, granting students SNG, often referred to as “1079” requirements. This includes non-U.S. citizens, including undocumented students.

**2020:** WCG guaranteed funding for all eligible students in statute.





# WA Grant Branding and Marketing



**WA Grant:** better promotes the Washington College Grant as a flexible option to be used for many college and career training pathways.

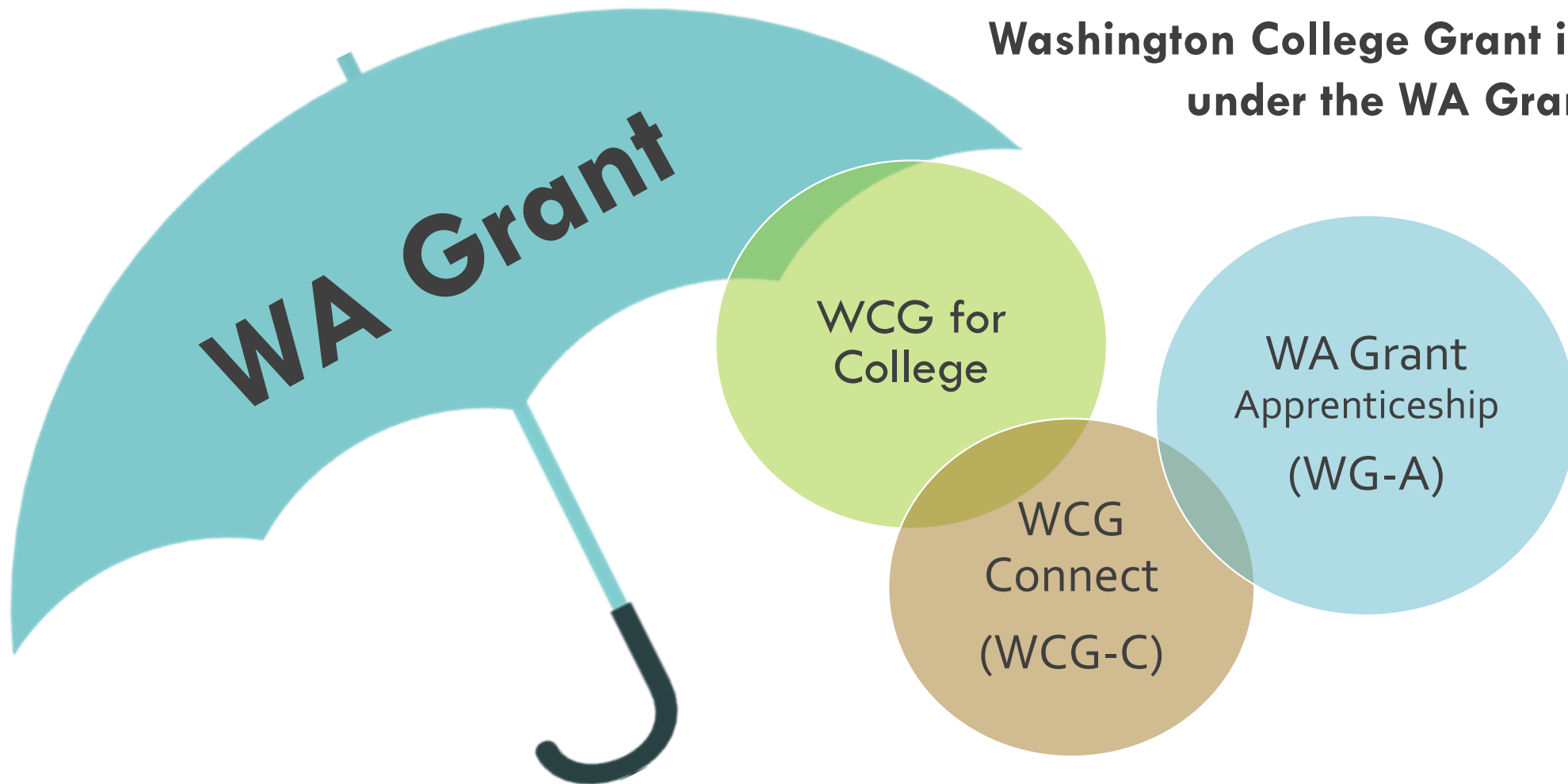

# Who is eligible?



Washington residents (including those with any immigration status)



Recent high school graduates or any adult (no age restrictions!)



Low- to middle-income families and individuals

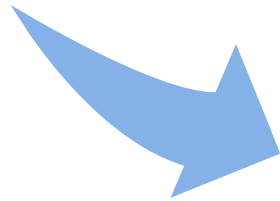


People who plan to attend an approved certificate program, job training, apprenticeship, or college, part-time or full-time



# Washington College Grant (WCG)

Washington College Grant is one of the most generous financial aid programs in the country. The award amount a student receives depends on family size, income, and the cost of their school or program.



Need is determined by Median Family Income (MFI), which is different from Federal programs that use the Student Aid Index (SAI)



# Washington College Grant (WCG)

**MFI** is determined annually – specific to an academic year.

# Washington College Grant (WCG)

## For Example:

Family Size	Full Award	Partial Award
 Eligible Student Family of 1	<b>Income</b> \$41,000 or less	<b>Income</b> Up to \$68,000
 Eligible Student Family of 4	\$78,500 or less	Up to \$131,000

# Washington College Grant (WCG)



## Program Requirements

A student must:

- ✓ Demonstrate financial need
- ✓ Be a resident of Washington state, attending an approved participating institution or apprenticeship program
- ✓ Have earned a high school diploma or equivalent
- ✓ Not be pursuing a degree in theology
- ✓ Not already achieved a bachelor's degree or higher
- ✓ Not be in default or owe a repayment on another state financial aid program

# Maximizing Financial Aid

WCG can cover tuition and fees.

Students can apply for federal aid in addition to the state aid they receive.

Completing the FAFSA can qualify a student for up to \$7,395 in additional aid.

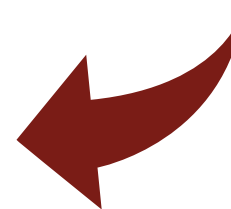

# Washington College Grant (WCG)



- What is the maximum time frame to receive WCG?
  - Students can receive the full-time award for up to 18 quarters or 12 semesters. That is 6 years of eligibility and aligns with Pell Grant limits as well!



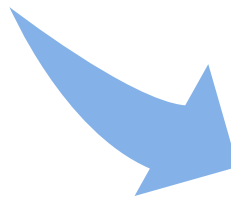

# Washington College Grant – Connect (WCG-C)

2SHB 1835 (2022) allows for automatic WCG income eligibility for students receiving any of the following public benefit programs:

- Aged, blind, or disabled assistance (ABD) benefits
- Essential needs and housing support program (HEN) benefits
- Pregnant women assistance program (PWA) financial grants

Effective July 1, 2023 for the 2023-24 Academic Year and beyond

The Washington College Grant – Connect (WCG-C) is intended to reduce the initial barrier to enrollment of a financial aid application.

These students will be verified as meeting the income requirement for WCG without having to complete a FAFSA or WASFA.

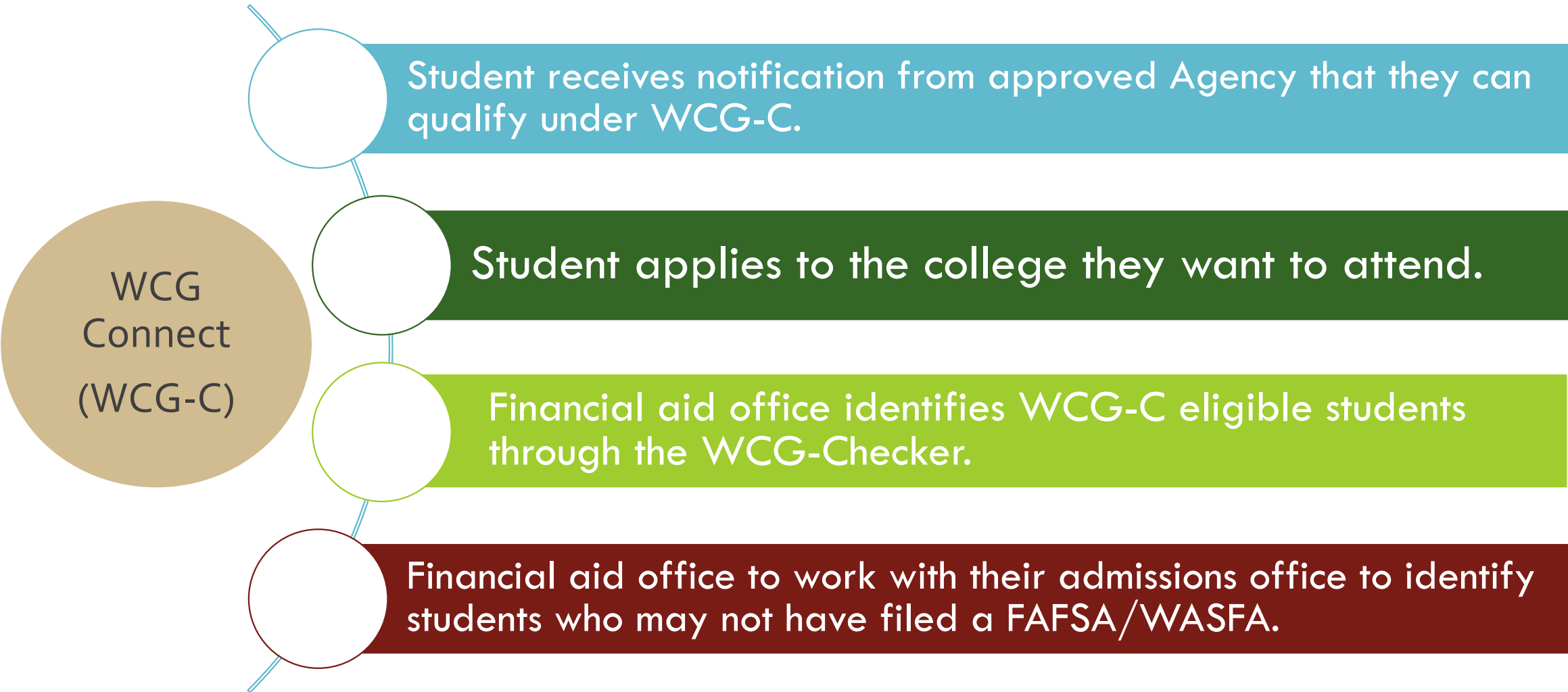

# WA Grant for Apprenticeship (WG-A)

- Washington College Grant – extended to State-Registered Apprentices.





# WG-A Legislative History

- **E2SSB 5764** (2022) – **Washington College Grant for Apprenticeship**
  - Changed WG-A maximum award value to align with CTC WCG award.
  - Apprentices doing RSI at CTC, to receive WG-A via college by 2025-26.
  - Study by Ruckelshaus Center – final report due in 2026.
- **SSHB 1835** (2022) – **Postsecondary Enrollment – Outreach and Completion Initiatives**
  - Eligibility for maximum WCG awards extended to those who receive eligible public assistance programs



# WG-A Legislative History

- **ESSB 5187 (2023) - 2023-2025 Fiscal Biennium Operating Appropriations**
  - Apprentices with 0% to 65% MFI are eligible to receive Maximum WCG award and \$500 WA Bridge Grant.
- **SB 5904 (2024) – Higher Education Financial Aid Programs - Eligibility**
  - Expanded WCG eligibility for six (6) years (18 quarters, 12 semester, or the equivalent hours).



# WG-A Legislative History

- **SSB 5785 (2025) – Washington College Grant and College Bound Scholarship – Modification**
  - Beginning on July 1 for the 2025-26 Fiscal Year:
    - The Median Family Income (MFI) required for a maximum WCG award was adjusted from 65% to 60%.
  - Beginning for the 2026-27 Fiscal Year:
    - WG-A Awards will be reduced to 50% of the WCG CTC award amount.
- **ESSB 5167 (2025) – 2025-2027 Fiscal Biennium Operating Appropriations**
  - WA Bridge Grants eliminated

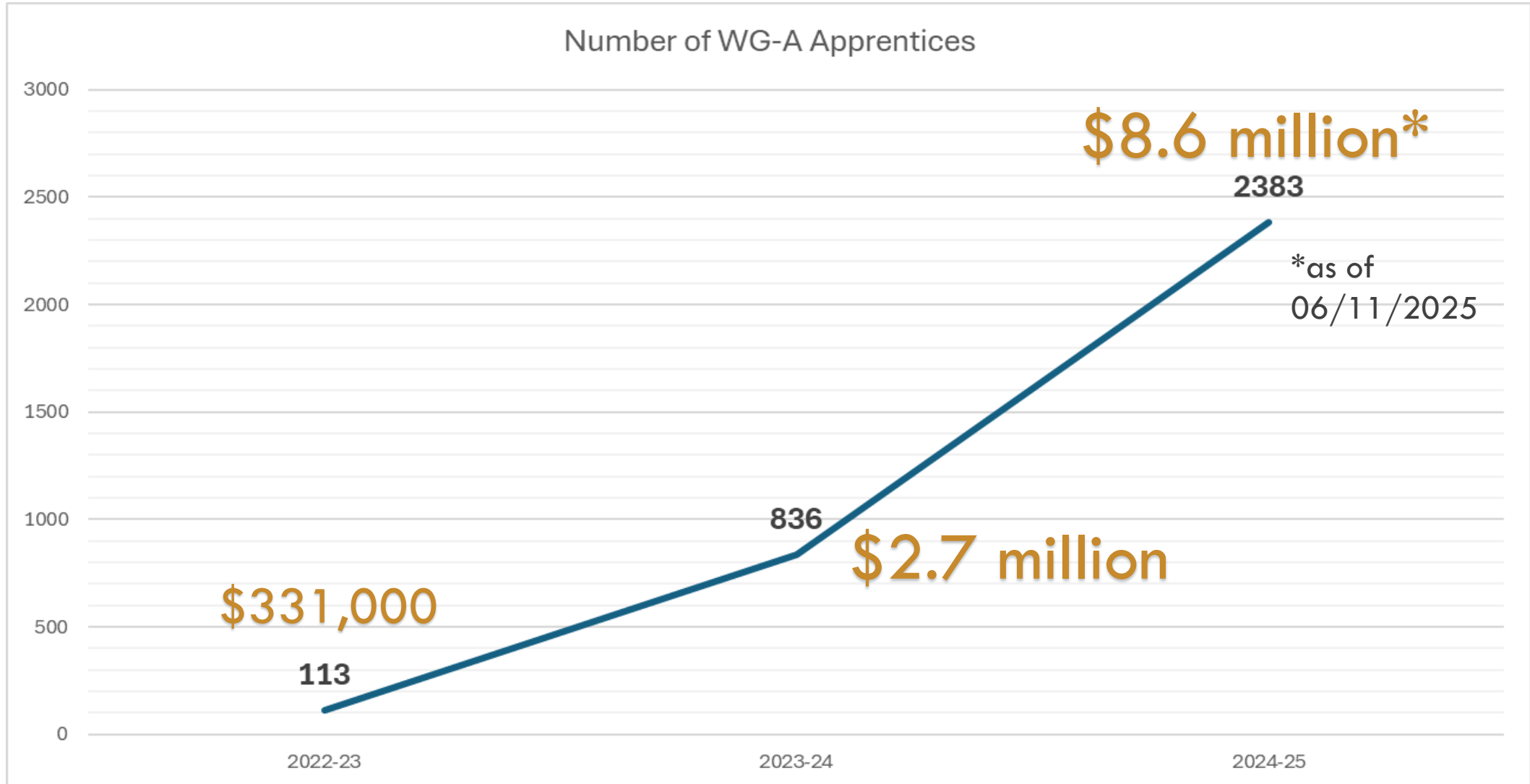

# Eligibility Requirements

- ✓ **Washington State Resident for at least 1-year**
- ✓ **High School Diploma or Equivalent or Ability to Benefit (ATB)**
- ✓ **Cannot have a bachelor's degree or higher**
- ✓ **Cannot owe money for state grant/loan**
- ✓ **Meet income requirements**
- ✓ **Be in an approved state-Registered Apprenticeship Program (RCW 28B.92.200)**
- ✓ **For returning applicants, meet satisfactory program progress (SPP) requirements**





# WA State-Registered Apprenticeships

- Established under chapter 49.04 RCW and corresponding WAC.
- Pre-Apprenticeship or State Recognized Apprenticeship Preparation Programs are not eligible.
- Minimum of 2,000 On-the-Job Training (OJT) Hours
- Minimum of 144 Related/Supplemental Instruction (RSI) Hours/Year

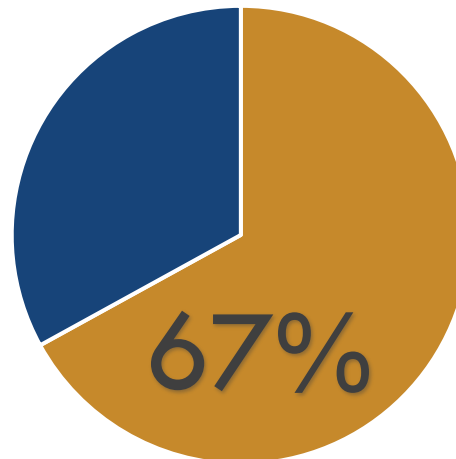
